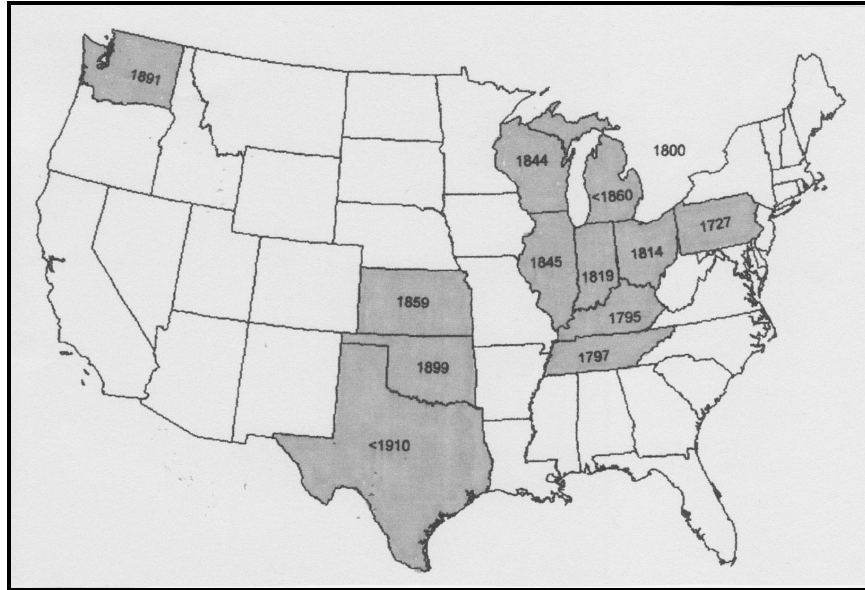


APPENDIX A: KERSTETTERS ON THE MOVE



The map shows Kerstetter families moving across the country from Pennsylvania in the years after 1727. The years noted within the states refer to the first arrival of families with Kerstetter, Castator, Castetter or similar last names. Exact or estimated years of arrival are used on the map.

The map highlights states with a significant number of Kerstetters as of 1930, the year of the last published U.S. census. There were just over 2,000 Kerstetters, Castators or Castetters reported in 1930. Nearly 60 percent of them were living in Pennsylvania, mostly in central Pennsylvania in areas not far removed from the first family homestead near Cleona.

Kerstetter was by far the most common spelling of the family's name. Castetter was the second most common spelling overall and the most common in Indiana. Castators were most often found in Ohio, Indiana and Michigan.

The first table below gives the total number of reported Kerstetters for states with at least 25 family members. The second table gives the major breakdown by counties in Pennsylvania.

There were no Kerstetters in either Tennessee or Kentucky, two of the states where family members first relocated in the late 1700s or early 1800s. In Ontario, the last published Canadian census was in 1911, and there were 18 Castators reported.

The second table does not include a very small number of Castators and Castetters who were living in Pennsylvania in 1930.
